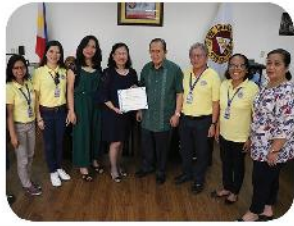

1899

Cientifico Universidad Literaria de Filipinas

Forerunner of Tarlac State University founded by Pres. Emilio Aguinaldo.



1902

Tarlac High School

The first public high school was established.



1906

Vocational Department of Tarlac High School

Created to offer intermediate grades.



1918

Full Secondary School

Tarlac Trade School evolved into a full secondary school.



1946

Vocational Department of Tarlac High School

Vocational Department was separated from Tarlac High School and was named Tarlac Trade School (TTS).



1956

Tarlac School of Arts and Trade

House Bill 1006 converted Tarlac Trade School (TTS) to Tarlac School of Arts and Trade (TSAT) which began to offer collegiate technical education courses.



1965

Tarlac College of Technology

Republic Act 4337 converted Tarlac School of Arts and Trade (TSAT) into the Tarlac College of Technology (TCT) and merged with Tarlac National Agricultural School (TNAS) in Camiling, Tarlac. TNAS became an Institute of Agriculture under TCT.



1975

Institute of Agriculture

(now Tarlac Agricultural University) was separated from TCT.



1989

Tarlac State University

Republic Act 6764 converted TCT to Tarlac State University.

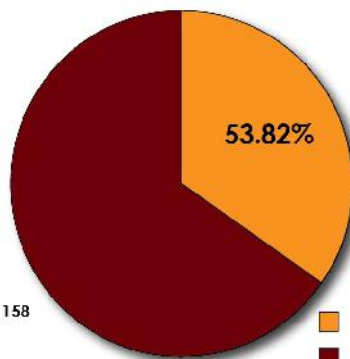

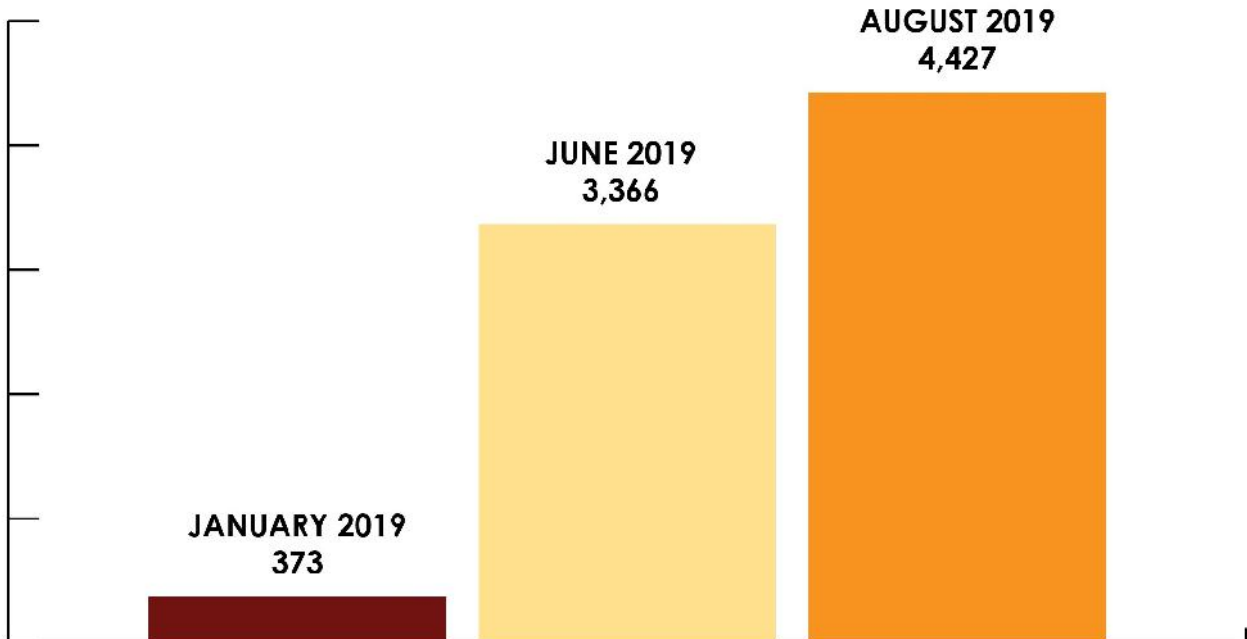

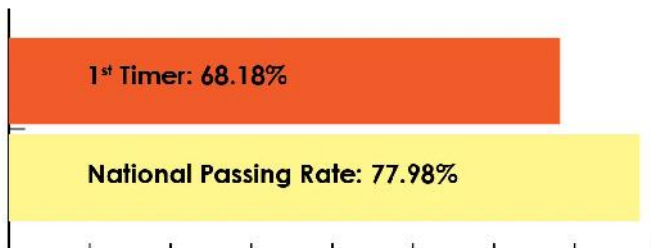

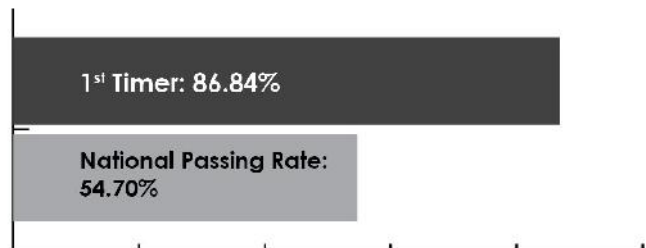

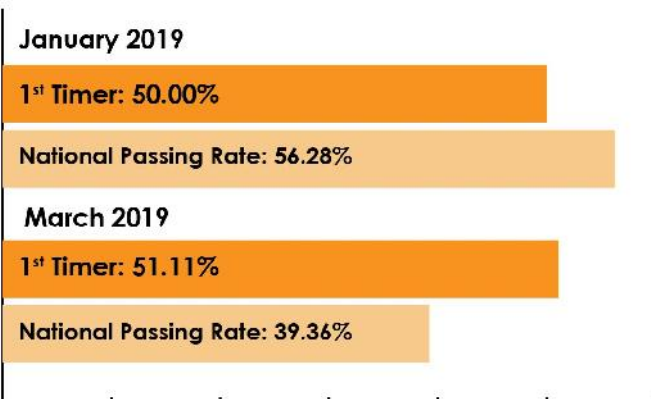


CRIMINOLOGIST LICENSURE EXAMINATION June 2019 TOP 3 PERFORMING SCHOOL IN PH

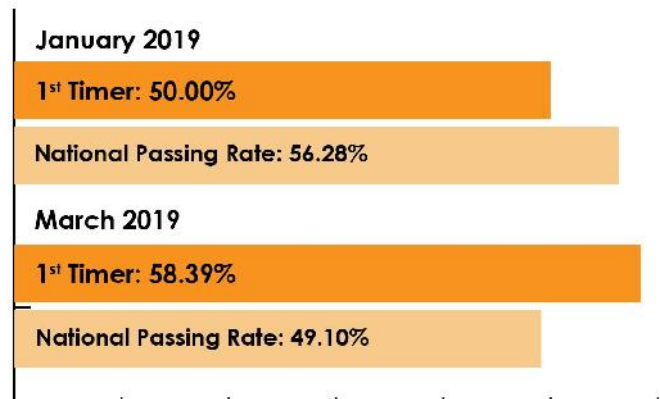

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN SECONDARY EDUCATION (BSED)

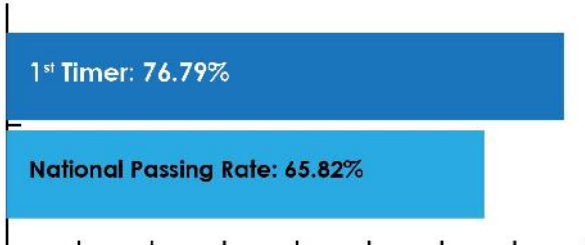

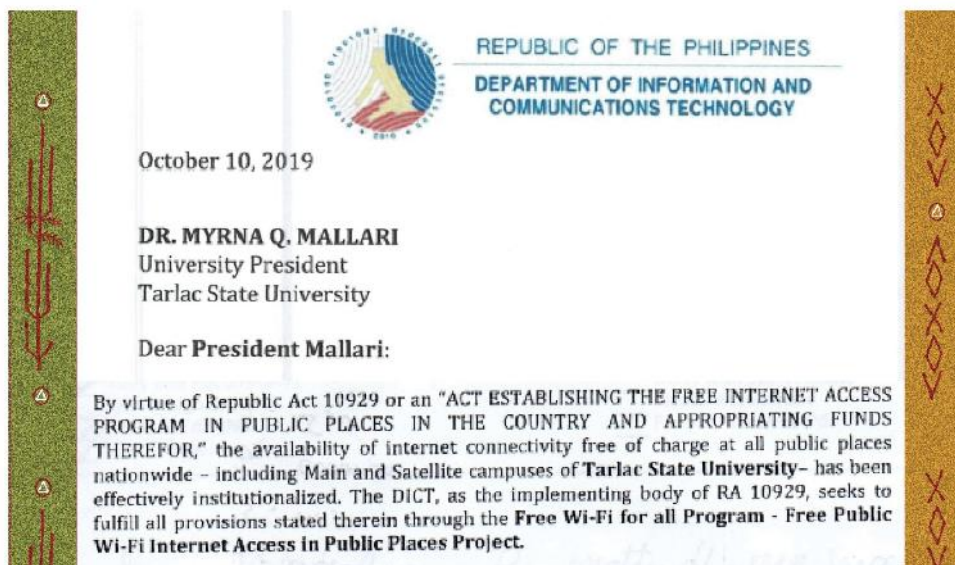

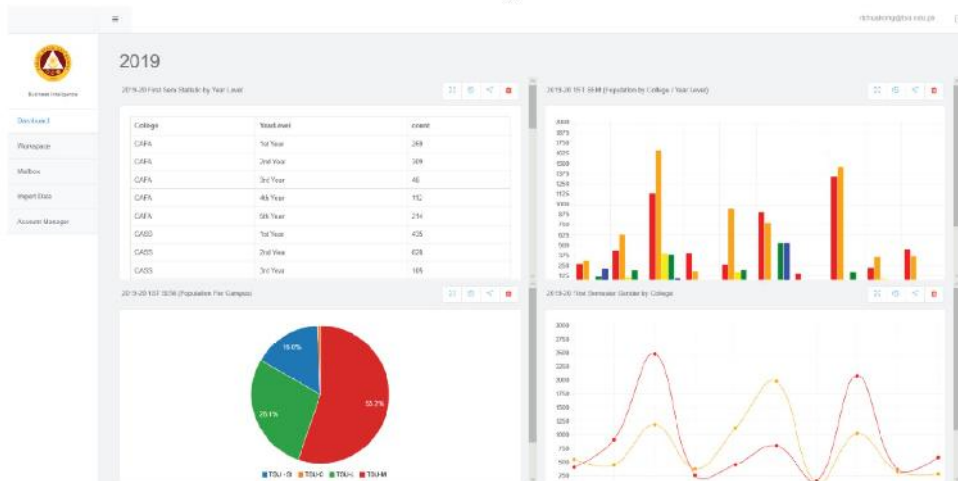
Hotel Management And Reservation System

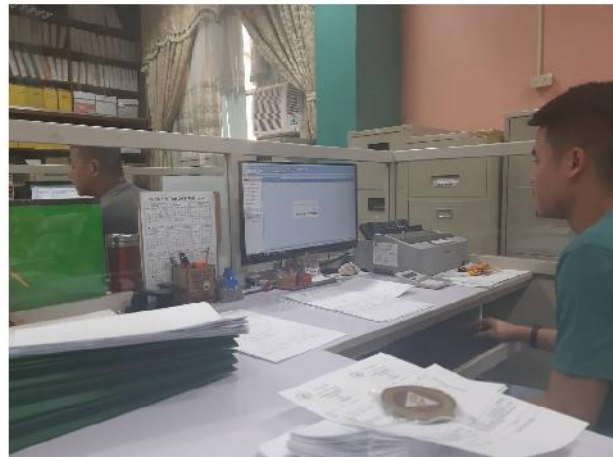


Deployment of Several PMAPS/HRIS Modules to End Users
